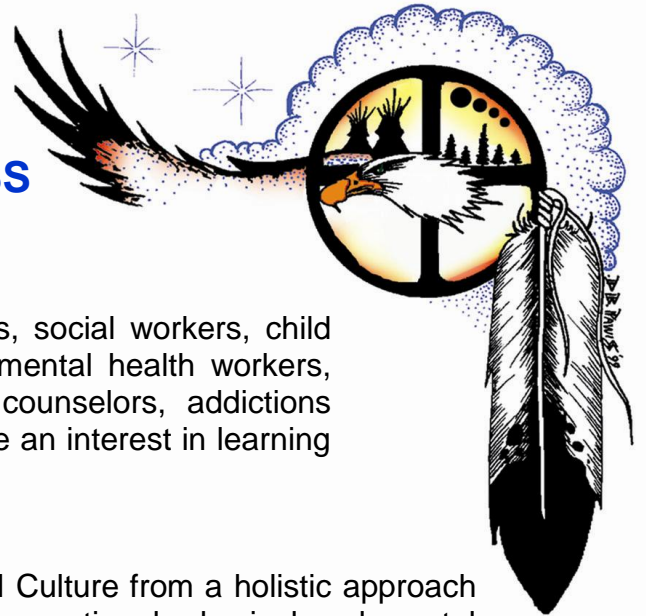

ABORIGINAL CULTURAL AWARENESS



Intended Audience:

This workshop is for teachers, educational assistants, social workers, child and youth care staff, child protection staff, nurses, mental health workers, probation officers, family support workers, career counselors, addictions counselors and foster parents. Anyone who may have an interest in learning about the Aboriginal culture is welcome.

Content:

Our one-day workshop is an introduction to Aboriginal Culture from a holistic approach using the medicine wheel - teaching from a spiritual, emotional, physical and mental perspective. We explore communication styles, historical and current issues that affect the Aboriginal people and society of today. This workshop meets the standards set out by the Canadian Accreditation Council of Human Services (CAC) and Canadian Council on Health Services Accreditation (CCHSA).

We offer 2 different one-day workshops. The Level 1 workshop is an introduction to Aboriginal perspectives to workshop participants who have not taken an Aboriginal Cultural Awareness workshop before. The Level 2 workshop is intended for those participants who have taken an Aboriginal Cultural Awareness workshop previously. There is the possibility of our instructor presenting a two-day in-depth Aboriginal Cultural Awareness workshop upon request. This certification is valid for 1 year.

SUICIDE INTERVENTION TRAINING

Intended Audience:

This workshop is for teachers, educational assistants, social workers, child and youth care staff, child protection staff, nurses, mental health workers, probation officers, family support workers, career counselors, addictions counselors, foster parents, policing and security personnel. Everyone is welcome, whether your interest is casual or professional. This certification is valid for 3 years.

Learning Objectives:

- To recognize that persons at risk are affected by personal and societal attitudes about suicide.
- To identify factors that indicate the risk of suicide.
- To understand how to discuss suicide with a person at risk.
- To demonstrate the skills required to intervene with a person at risk of suicide.
- To identify the resources, including themselves, available to a person at risk of suicide.
- To gain commitment to help coordinate social support resources for persons at risk of suicide.

CRISIS INTERVENTION & NON-ABUSIVE RESTRAINT

PRESENTED BY THE CANADIAN INSTITUTE FOR CRISIS INTERVENTION TRAINING
(CICIT)

Intended Audience:

This workshop is for teachers, educational assistants, social workers, child and youth care staff, child protection staff, nurses, mental health workers, probation officers, family support workers, career counselors, addictions counselors, foster parents, students in child and youth care, and policing and security programs. This certification is valid for 3 years.

Learning Objectives:

Prevention – This component of the program requires participants to evaluate their own reactions to verbal and physical aggression. In addition, participants will assess their approach to individuals who are aggressive and challenging.

De-escalation – Techniques provide participants with training in verbal and non-verbal intervention for defusing and stabilizing an escalating situation in a non-threatening manner.

De-briefing – Trains participants to process the incident with the individual and teach alternative behaviors. This component includes an outline for de-briefing strategies for clients and staff.

Physical Interventions – This includes escorts and control techniques. All techniques allow for maximum control and safety of the individual and the staff performing the intervention.

Personal Safety – Participants will learn how to protect themselves in situations where they are at imminent risk of injury. All techniques are meant to maximize safety for the participants and to control, not injure, their assailant.

Bruce Armson has a Diploma in Child and Youth Care from Grant MacEwan Community College and is trained in Mediation and Conflict Resolution. He has over 20 years of experience working with youth in a variety of settings. Bruce developed Non-Abusive Crisis Intervention and has been teaching it for over eleven years. He has over 25 years of training in the Martial Arts. Through this training, Bruce developed a high level of knowledge in body kinesiology and physical interventions, which has been incorporated into the Crisis Intervention training program to provide safe and painless interventions and control techniques. Bruce is the Director of Group Care Services at Bosco Homes.

Dr. M. Blackman, MA, MB, MRCPsych, FRCPC, DABFE, DABFM, is Bosco Homes' Clinical Director. He is a Clinical Professor at the University of Alberta and widely published in his field. He has over 20 years of experience working with children and adolescents in both outpatient and inpatient settings and in providing clinical research and consultation services within multi-disciplinary team settings.

Blain Clouthier, B.P.E., has been teaching First Aid/CPR with Bosco Homes for 9 years. He is a certified First Aid/CPR instructor with EMP Canada and is certified as an Emergency Medical Responder. He is a certified Crisis Intervention Non-Abusive Restraint instructor with the Canadian Institute For Crisis Intervention Training (CICIT). As well he is a certified trainer with Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI). His duties involve the presentation of workshops for: First Aid/CPR, Crisis Intervention Non-Abusive Restraint, Suicide Intervention and Defensive Driving . Blain is the Staff Training Coordinator for Bosco Homes.

Dee Gerro has a Diploma in Correctional Services. She has worked with intensive clients for eight years as well as with Animal Assisted Therapy Program. Dee is employed with the Canadian Accreditation Council of Human Services. She has been an instructor for the First Aid/CPR courses at Bosco Homes for several years.

Carol Hrenyk, B.A., received her degree in Child and Youth Care Counseling from the University of Victoria and has over 19 years of experience in the child care field. In the Yukon, Carol managed the Children's Receiving and Assessment Home and also worked for Child Abuse Treatment Services. In Alberta, Carol has worked as a counselor on the Alexis Reserve, YYC, as well as a Mental Health Therapist for CASA. She has been with Bosco Homes for over ten years as a House Manager and is now the Coordinator of Group Care & Psychological Services. Carol is also a trainer for the Crisis Intervention Non-Abusive Restraint workshops.

Dominic Hill has a diploma in Child and Youth Care Services from Success College in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Dominic has been working as a child and youth care worker for over ten years. Specializing in Remote Wilderness Therapy, Dominic teaches survival skills to youth ages 12 to 18 years, along with being an instructor for the Crisis Intervention Non-Abusive Restraint and First Aid/CPR workshops.

Sheldon Hughes is a Cree from the Slave Lake Area. He has worked extensively in the Child and Youth Care field in front line and management/supervisory capacities, and has helped develop Aboriginal programming for Alberta's Kids in Care. Sheldon has worked in the Aboriginal political realm for the last 10 years, becoming heavily involved in such areas as First Nations Governance, Economic Development, Membership, Treaty Implementation, Social Development and Representative Organization Development. Sheldon has a strong background in Aboriginal Cultural understanding and Community Development and shares teachings from a Cree perspective.

Bill Killinger has worked with children at risk in a variety of settings for ten years and has instructed Crisis Intervention Non Abusive Restraint for over five years. Bill is trained in addictions counseling through the Nechi Institute and is an assistant instructor at the Real Self Defense Centre located in Edmonton, Alberta.

Kathy McKinnon, B.A., major Psychology, minor Native Studies is from the Gwich'in Nation (Aklavik, NWT). She also attended the University of New South Wales in Sydney, Australia as part of an Aboriginal Exchange Program. Kathy is active in the Aboriginal community and sits on various Aboriginal boards. She has worked with educational communities such as: the University of Alberta, Gran MacEwan Community College, Nova Corporation and the Native Counseling Services of Alberta. Kathy is the Director of Aboriginal Services for Bosco Homes.

Sue Shaw, MA. RSW. Has worked as a social worker and therapist with children, families and adults in Edmonton for over 25 years. She training with the ASIST program and has been conducting Suicide Intervention training in Northern Alberta and NWT since 1997.
