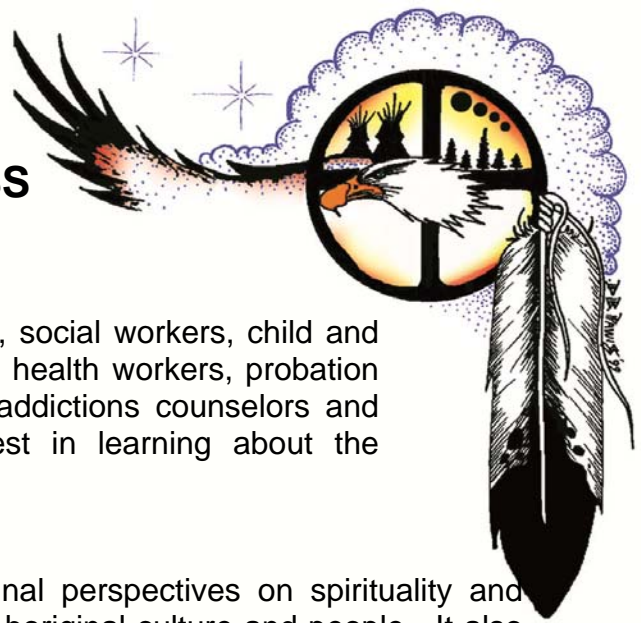

Our one-day workshop is an introduction to Aboriginal perspectives on spirituality and protocol. It reviews the “Do’s and Don’ts” regarding Aboriginal culture and people. It also touches on a historical decision made hundreds of years ago that still affects the Aboriginal people and society of today. This workshop meets the standards set out by the Canadian Accreditation Council of Human Services (CAC) and Canadian Council on Health Services Accreditation (CCHSA). SUICIDE INTERVENTION/SELF HARM TRAINING

Intended Audience:

This workshop is for teachers, educational assistants, social workers, child and youth care staff, child protection staff, nurses, mental health workers, probation officers, family support workers, career counselors, addictions counselors, foster parents, policing and security personnel. Everyone is welcome, whether your interest is casual or professional. Once the workshop is completed, a one day recertification is required every 3 years prior to the expiry date on the previous certificate.

Learning Objectives:

- To recognize that persons at risk are affected by personal and societal attitudes about suicide.
- To recognize behaviours or behavioural patterns indicating self harm.
- To understand the “Duty of Care” issues when dealing with self harm.
- To understand the documentation required for suicide/self harm.
- To identify factors that indicate the risk of suicide.
- To understand how to discuss suicide with a person at risk.
- To demonstrate the skills required to intervene with a person at risk of suicide/self harm.
- To identify the resources, including themselves, available to a person at risk of suicide/self harm.
- To gain commitment to help coordinate social support resources for persons at risk of suicide.
